The Origin of Engineering Ethics By Dave K. Adams, P.E. NM #28805



In May 1922, mechanical engineering professor Alexander Graham Christie (Johns Hopkins University) wrote an article entitled "A Proposed Code of Ethics for Engineers" (Christie, A. G. (1922). A Proposed Code of Ethics for All Engineers. The ANNALS of the American Academy of Political and Social Science, 101(1), 97-104. https://doi.org/10.1177/000271622210100115), in which he reminded his readers that the profession of engineering was (still) slow in becoming recognized as a true

profession, or even a true business. He explains that a professional career implies a sense of responsibility to the public, and that a well understood code of ethics must be recognized by the public so that they know what to expect from members of that profession. The work of an engineer advances social objectives, and it is not enough for us to simply say "trust me" – the public requires something more foundational and definitive: A properly constructed and vetted code of ethics.

Two of the most well-known professions in history, medicine and law, have had published ethical standards for centuries, whereas the first recognized professional engineering society can only be traced back to 1818 (Institution of Civil Engineers, England). Its members recognized a need for their own ethical standards that could be accepted by society, but the first attempt at codification did not happen until December 1920, when a committee of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers prepared a draft version of a code of ethics for.......


